Ninety years ago today, the school envisioned by Carmelita Hinton opened. The Putney School held its first classes and began its "progressive experiment."

From Sue McIntosh Lloyd '52's book, about the school's opening:


It poured rain. The boys' dorm was not yet closed in; mothers in high heels and fathers in business suits opened the front doors and looked through the back wall to the streets beyond. They could see the puddles on the floors and the ladders that still served as stairways to the second floor. One grandmother was far from pleased to see the principal climbing up and down ladders, settling boys in. ... Girls moving into their rooms off the Assembly Hall discovered that finished dormitories at Putney sheltered vegetables in their cellars and that the celery was rotting. But no child was taken home again, to the principal's great joy.

Ninety years.

From that ambitious, optimistic, rain-soaked beginning, we have generations of students, alumni, teachers, and families who have thrown their energy, creativity, and vision into this school. Here's to you all.
